



CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUNIOR MEMBERS

Mole Valley Orienteering Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members.

The Club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the Club should, at all times, show respect for each other, be encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the Club with the Designated Officer(s).

As a member of Mole Valley Orienteering Club you are expected to abide by the following junior club rules:

- All members must compete within the rules and respect officials (planners, controllers and organisers) and their decisions
- All members must respect other competitors ('fair play' in orienteering includes not tampering with controls)
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late
- Members should wear suitable clothes for training and competitions and bring their own orienteering equipment (compass, whistle, map bag, pens etc) to sessions (club coaches will be able to lend some equipment to beginners)
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke, or to consume alcohol or illegal drugs of any kind, at training sessions or when representing the Club in competitions.

This Code of Conduct applies to junior members as defined by the British Orienteering Federation and was adopted by Mole Valley Orienteering Club Committee and is effective from 4 October 2007.

The Designated Officer is currently the Master and, failing the Master, the Child Protection Officer.
